The Passive Voice

A passive sentence consist of;

- √ The subject
- ✓ The verb to be in the correct tense.
- ✓ The past participle of the verb needed.
- ✓ Sometimes, the agent and/or other complements

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Subject + verb + "to be" + Past participle
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- The novel was read by Mom in one day.
- This film wasn't liked by no one.
- The windows had been broken.

When to use Passive Voice?

- We use passive when we are most interested in the action than the person who does it, or when we don't know the active subject.
- We generally use passive voice in Descriptive text types, like:
- Formal reports.
- Description of some process.
- Academic writings (like Reporting of scientefic experiments)

Past Simple I made a cake. A cake was made.

Past Continuous I was making a cake. A cake was being made.

Present Perfect I have made a cake A cake has been made.

Past Perfect I had made a cake. A cake had been made.

Future Simple I will make a cake. A cake will be made.

Future be going to I'm going to make a cake. A cake is going to be made.

Modal I must make a cake. A cake must be made.

Modal Perfect I should have made a A cake should have been cake. A cake should have been made.
