Colour by Calculation

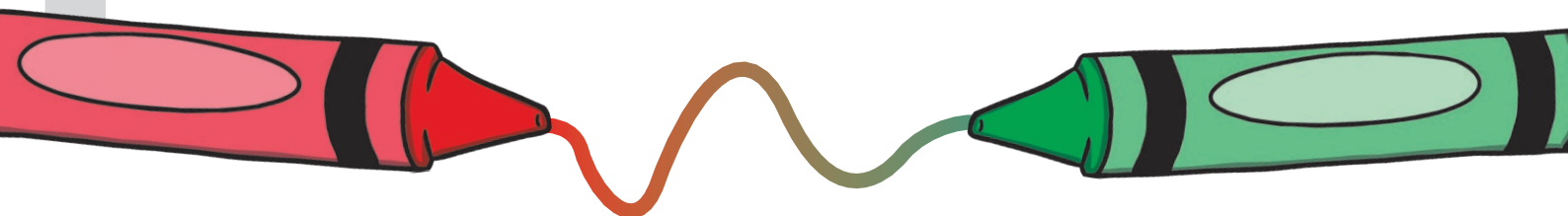


Work out the answer to each calculation and then use the key to colour each section the correct colour. Can you work out what the picture is? Which country is it associated with?

Loch Ness Monster



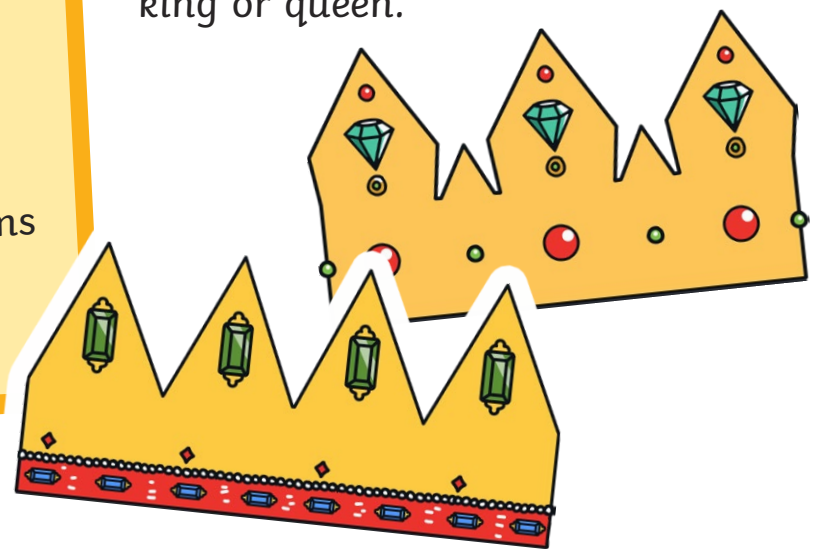


Make a Crown Craft

Did you know that the King of the United Kingdom is called Charles? His mother was Queen Elizabeth II and she was the Queen for 70 years! Follow the instructions to make your own crown fit for a king or queen.

You will need:

- cardboard (e.g cereal box)
- stapler or sticky tape
- scissors
- coloured pens/paint
- decorations, such as pom-poms
- white glue

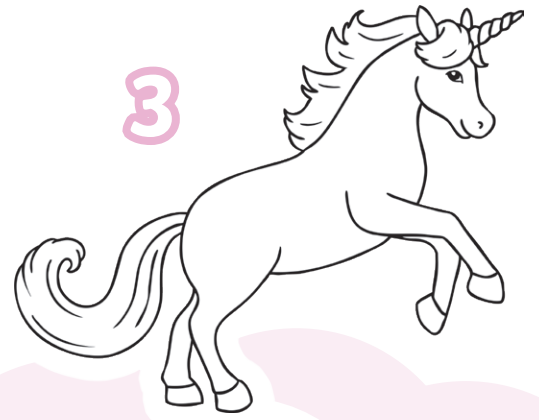
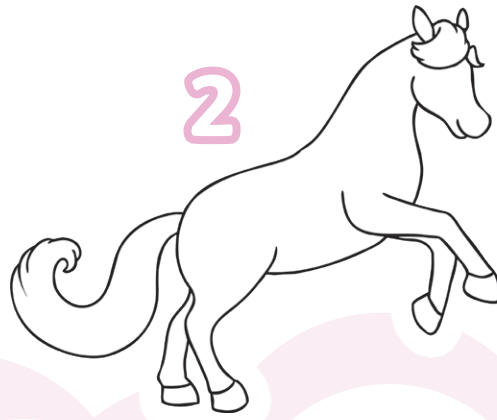
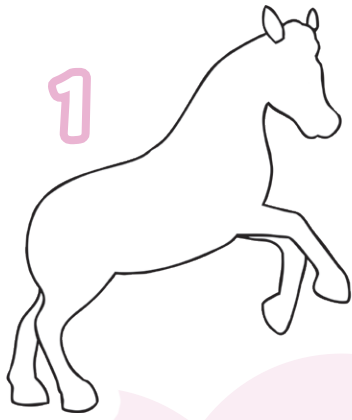


Instructions:

1. Ask an adult to help you draw a crown template on some cardboard and then carefully cut around it. (You may need an adult to help you with this if the cardboard is thick.)
2. Wrap the crown around your head to make sure it is the correct size.
3. Lay the cardboard flat so that the blank side is facing upwards.
4. Use coloured pens or paint to decorate your crown using your favourite colours or patterns.
5. Once the pens or paint are dry, use white glue to add any extra decorations, such as pom-poms.
6. Tape or staple the two ends of the crown together.

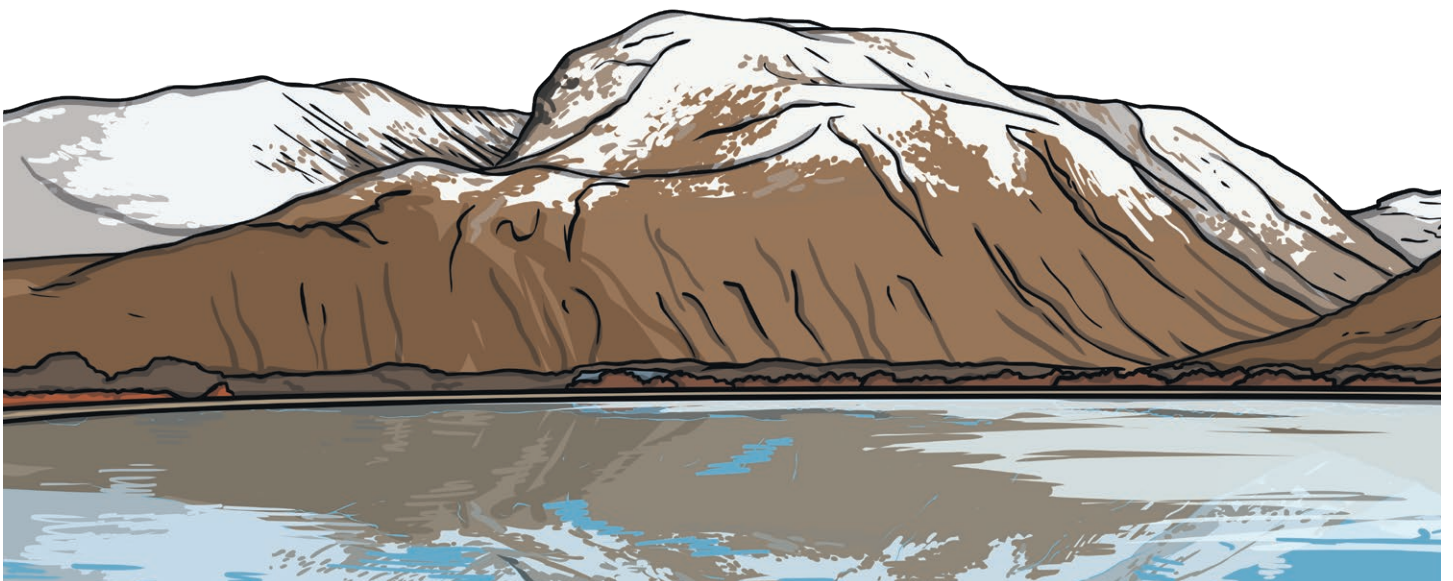

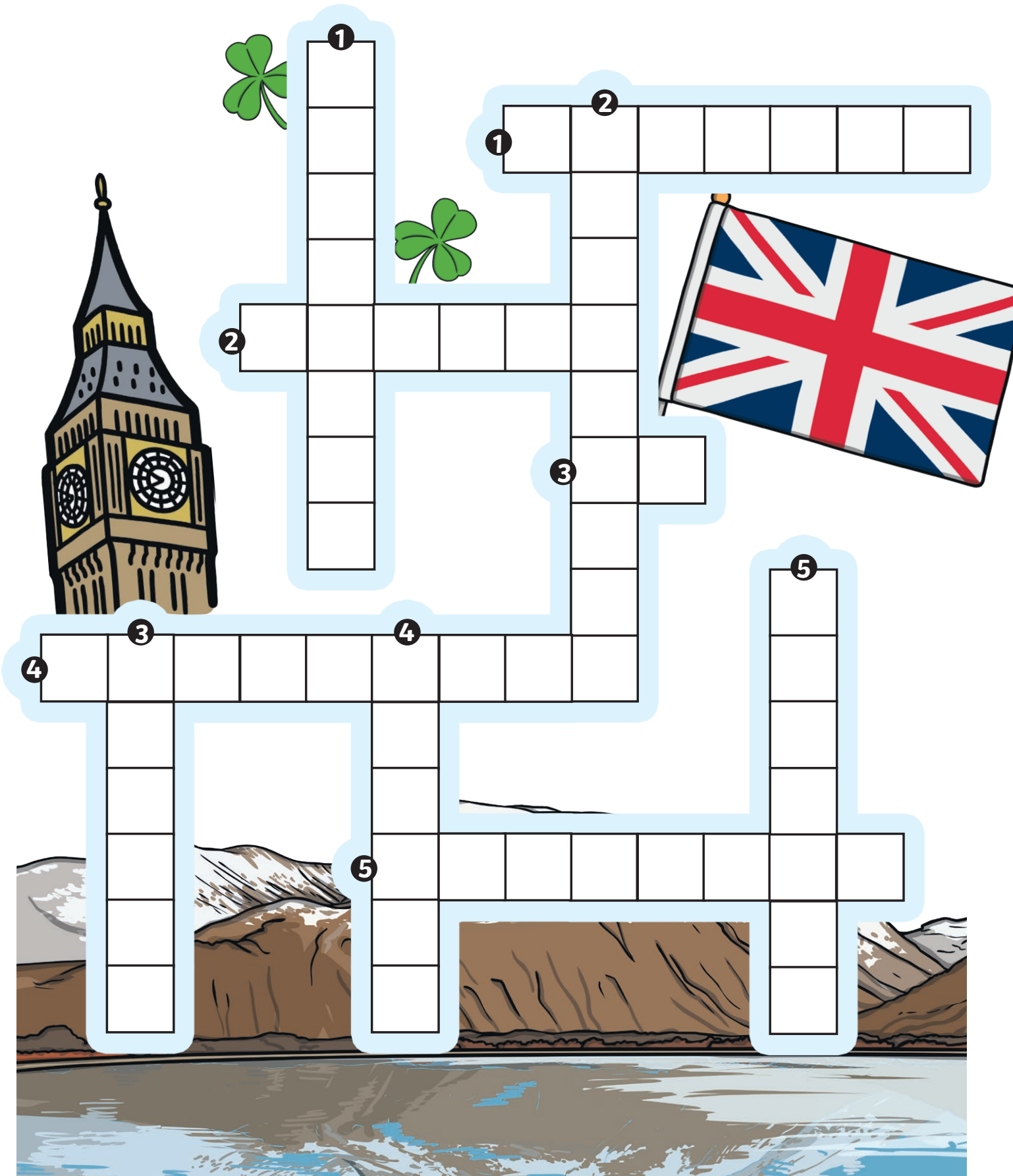

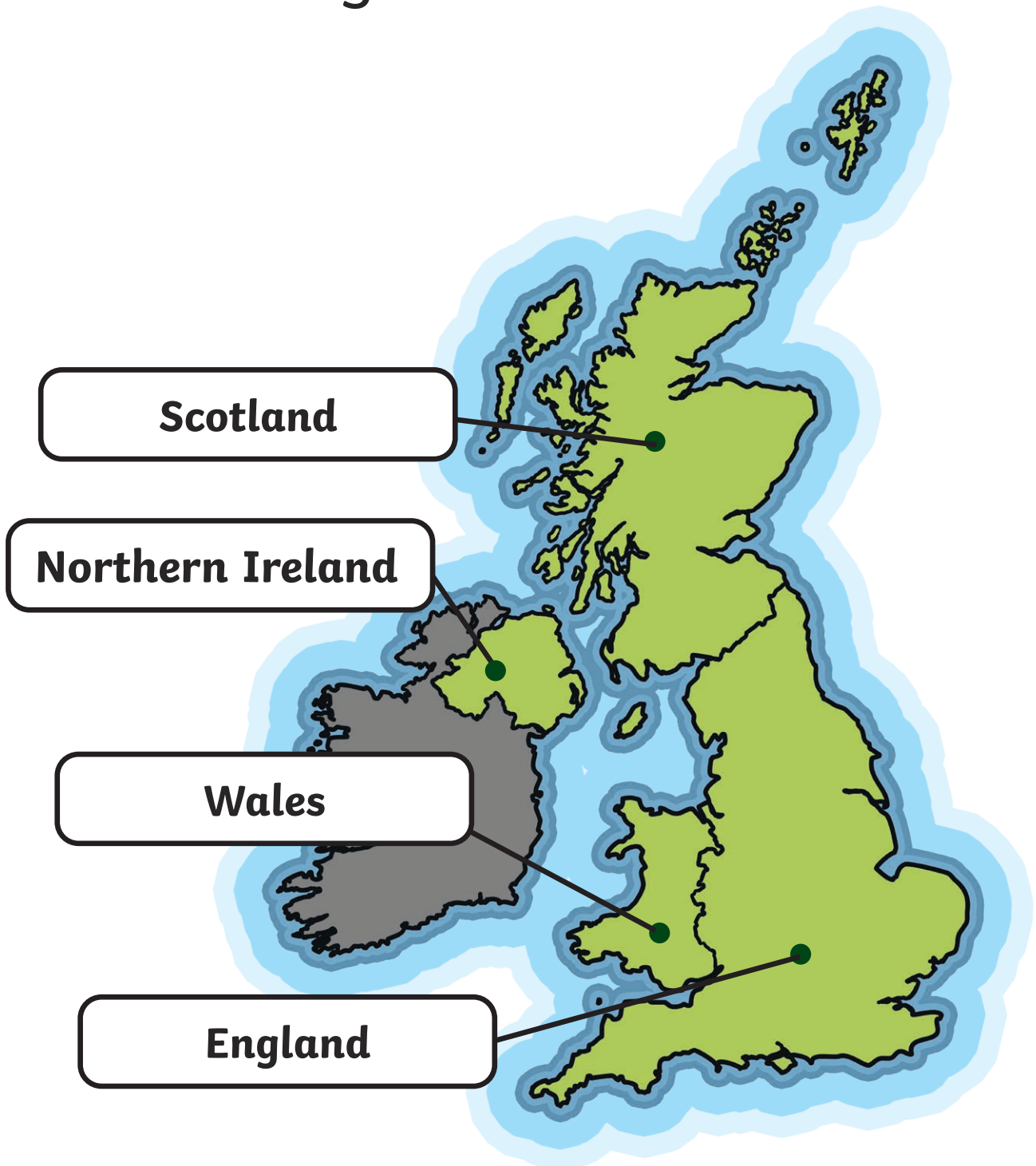
