

3-2-1 Reading Summary

Student Activity: In this printable activity, students complete a 3-2-1 Graphic Organizer to summarize what they learned.

It also includes pages for vocabulary, reading the article and taking notes, short answer questions, multiple choice questions, and a discussion worksheet for open-ended prompts.

How to share with students: These pages are sized for printing or can be assigned digitally using an LMS (like Google Classroom), where students can work on their own slide decks via “Make a Copy for Each Student.” Each slide is set up with text boxes for students to type in.

Please Note: Because Diffit resources can vary in length, be sure to check the formatting on each slide.

Suggested Lesson Flow:

1. Students record what they notice and what they wonder about the image.
2. Complete the 3-2-1 Graphic Organizer
3. Students read and take notes.
4. Students answer the questions and explain their thinking.
5. Students write answers to the short answer questions.
6. Have students complete the Open Ended Questions and discuss with partners or groups.

Many famous singers joined together to record the song. Lionel Richie and Michael Jackson wrote the song. Other stars like Stevie Wonder, Tina Turner, and Bruce Springsteen also sang on it. Quincy Jones, a famous producer, helped make the song. He told everyone to leave their egos "out of the door" so they could work together.

The singers recorded "We Are the World" in one night. They all gathered at a recording studio in Los Angeles. It was a special night because so many big stars were in the same room. The song became very popular and made a lot of money.
