REPORTED SPEECH - QUESTIONS

IMPORTANT! The question always becomes an affirmative sentence. The tense of the sentence is always changed to a previous one.

CASE 1: The answer is a sentence with new information.

- **A-** Question with auxiliar DO / DOES / DID Examples:
 - Where do you go on weekends?

He asked me where X | went on weekends.

The SUBJECT is sometimes changed. In this example it was.

The word order is the same in direct and reported speech but in the second one the AUXILIAR is not used.

• What time did Mary arrive last morning?



In the second example the SUBJECT is <u>not</u> changed.

He asked me what time **X** Mary had arrived the morning before.

- How often does Paul go to swimming lessons?
- **B-** Questions with verb TO BE and with auxiliars CAN, MUST, WILL, HAVE, MAY, etc.. Examples:



The word order is different in direct and reported form. When reporting a question it becomes SUBJECT + VERB (in a previous tense)

• What can we do tomorrow in the evening?



He asked what we could do the following day in the evening.

When will you finish your homework?

CASE 2: The answer is YES or NO

- **A-** Question with auxiliar DO / DOES / DID Examples:
 - Do you like carrots?

He asked me IF I liked carrots

The word order is the same in direct and reported speech but in the second one the AUXILIAR is not used. The sentence is intoduced by IF.

Does Jason watch TV at night?

He asked me IF Jason watched TV at night.

- Did they visit you yesterday?
- **B-** Questions with verb TO BE and with auxiliars CAN, MUST, WILL, HAVE, MAY, etc..
 - Is Julie at home?

Examples:

He asked me IF Julie was at home.

The word order is different in direct and reported form. When reporting a question it becomes SUBJECT + VERB (in a previous tense)

• Will you come later?

He asked me IF I would go later

Has Paul got any brothers ?
